## Methodology

This is the first of a six-part series of reports tracking the diffusion of misinformation in the 2020 U.S. presidential election. Data in this wave were collected from an online panel of American adults, collected by Qualtrics. Data were collected from 20th Aug to 7th Sep. The sample size was 597 (Margin of error $\approx 4 \%$ ). The sample was $52 \%$ female. The average age was 47.45 , with a range of 18 to 88 . The sample was $63 \%$ white, 13\% African American, and 15\% Latino/a.
